



CERVICAL BIOPSY

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

What can I expect after a cervical biopsy?

Bleeding/Discharge:

- Following the biopsy you will have a small wound on your cervix that will need time to heal. While the wound is healing you will experience blood stained vaginal discharge, which may also be black, brown and have a gritty consistency.
- This may last for 4-7 days and it should not be heavier than a period.

Pain:

- You may experience some period like discomfort/cramps. This will normally settle down after a few hours.
- If you need pain relief; take paracetamol or ibuprofen (follow instructions on package).

Precautions:

- To aid the healing of the wound on your cervix and reduce your risk of infection, avoid sex, tampons, swimming and baths for 1 week.

How would I know if I had an infection?

If you have bleeding which is heavier than a period or if the discharge is smelly or lasts longer than ten days, you could have an infection. Contact your doctor or the hospital to check whether you need antibiotics or not.

Will I get any results after my cervical biopsy?

You will receive a letter, in the post, with the result and follow up management within six weeks.
