#### **VISITING NICU**

Parents of babies in our Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) are welcome to spend time with their baby/babies at any time. Parents may be asked to step out of the unit during nursing handovers, ward rounds or if there is an emergency.

Grandparents are welcome to visit between

5.30pm and 7.30pm daily while accompanied by a parent.
